

Committees:

Publicity: Reports weekly play day winners and any news worthy events to the State Port Pilot. Weekly Events Committee responsible for providing information to Chairperson.

Historian: Photographs OIWGA activities throughout the year.

Birdie Tree: All birdies earned during play day are posted on the bulletin board in the locker room. Play day birdies count towards end of year prizes. Weekly Events Committee responsible for providing information to Chairperson. Birdies earned on non-play days are posted on the bulletin board in the locker room. Non-playday birdies do not count towards end of year awards. OIWGA member responsible for submitting signed and attested scorecard into birdie box located in the locker room.

Rules: Is knowledgeable about USGA Rules and provides ruling, if necessary. Reviews local OIWGA rules and adjusts accordingly.

Local Rules:

1. Holes 14 and 18: After two balls are hit in the water, then carry to the other side of the hazard without penalty for carry.
 - a. #14 carry to 200 yard marker
 - b. #18 carry to drop area in front of green
2. Hole 8: All relief is to be taken on the left side of the cart path, no closer to the hole.
3. Holes 8, 11 and 14: Any ball that crosses a public road is considered Out of Bounds and must be rehit from the original spot
Preferred Lie: A player with ball in own fairway may improve lie by placing the ball within one club length, no closer to the hole. (4/10/96

Lady Birds: "Ladybirds" is a league for women golfers in Brunswick County. It's been in existence for 21 years, and Oak Island was a charter member. The clubs included are Brick Landing, Brierwood, Carolina National, Lockwood Folly, Magnolia Greens, Meadowlands/Farmstead, Oak Island, Sea Trail, St. James, and The Lakes. Each year, every club hosts a tournament. To be eligible to play in the tournament, a player must have a maximum index of 40 and be a member of her ladies' golf association.

Sign-up sheets are posted in the locker rooms 3 weeks before each tournament. Each club is allotted a certain number of players, but alternates are encouraged to sign up for extra spots in the tourney. Prizes (a sleeve of balls) are given in each flight according to low gross, 2nd low gross, low net, 2nd low net, and low putts. There's a maximum of 10 strokes within each flight. There is a host club that has the final tourney, The Cup. In The Cup, 8 players are chosen per club, and the 7 low nets are counted for the total/win. There is also an end of the year Luncheon. To qualify to play in The Cup and to attend the Luncheon, a player must have played in at least 2 tournaments.

Sunshine: Sunshine sends cards to members who are ill or who have had a death in the family. We also make memorial donations for members and immediate family (husband, significant other, child) who have passed away in the amount of \$25.00. We send Thinking of You Cards to those who haven't been able to play for awhile due to either their illness or a family member's. Keeps an OIWGA member abreast of significant events occurring with members.

Member Care: Provides support, care and/or food to members during a time of need such as illness, accident, surgery or death in family.

Memorial Garden: In 2006, The Oak Island Women's Golf Association elected to develop a garden in memory of WGA members who have died. The garden was located beside the 18th green with a bench, purchased by the WGA. The Garden is currently maintained by a committee of WGA volunteers, in conjunction with OIGC Maintenance Department.

Social: The Social Committee helps with any Tournament as requested by the Committees, and any off site parties associated with the tournaments, this includes the tournament check-in and decorating.

Tournaments:

Sadie Hawkins: Tournament in which an OIWGA member invites a male golfer to participate. Tournament format changes yearly.

Member/Guest: Tournament in which an OIWGA member invites a guest with an established handicap from another course to participate. Tournament format changes yearly.

Member/Member: Tournament in which two OIWGA members participate. Tournament format changes yearly.

Special Tournaments:

OIWGA/Lakes Challenge: Held yearly around October in which members from The Lakes and OIWGA play to determine who brings home the trophy. Site alternates every year. Even-The Lakes, Odd-Oak Island.

Linksters/OIWGA: Held twice yearly. Members from the Linksters, OIWGA or general public may participate in the tournament. Tournament format changes for each event.
